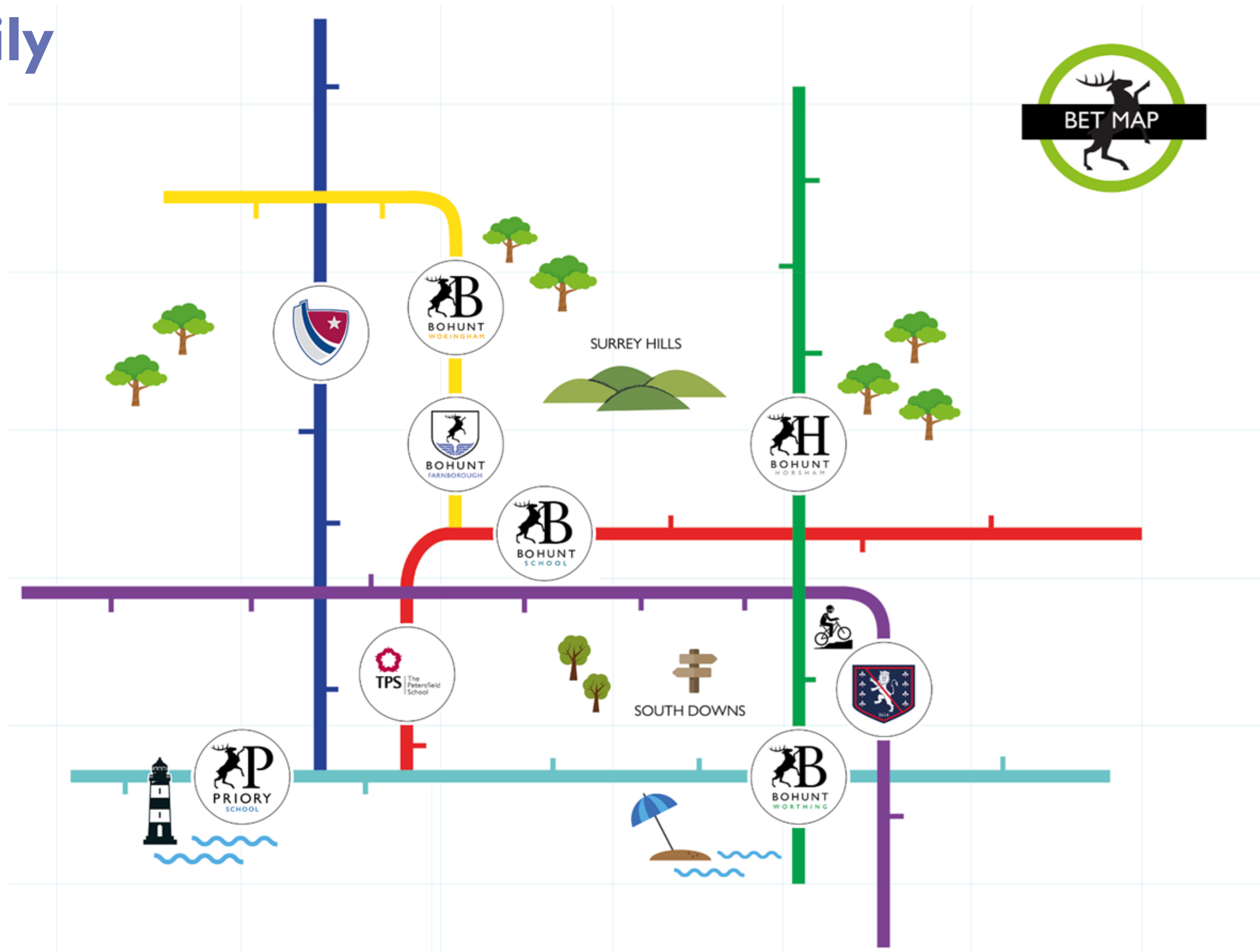

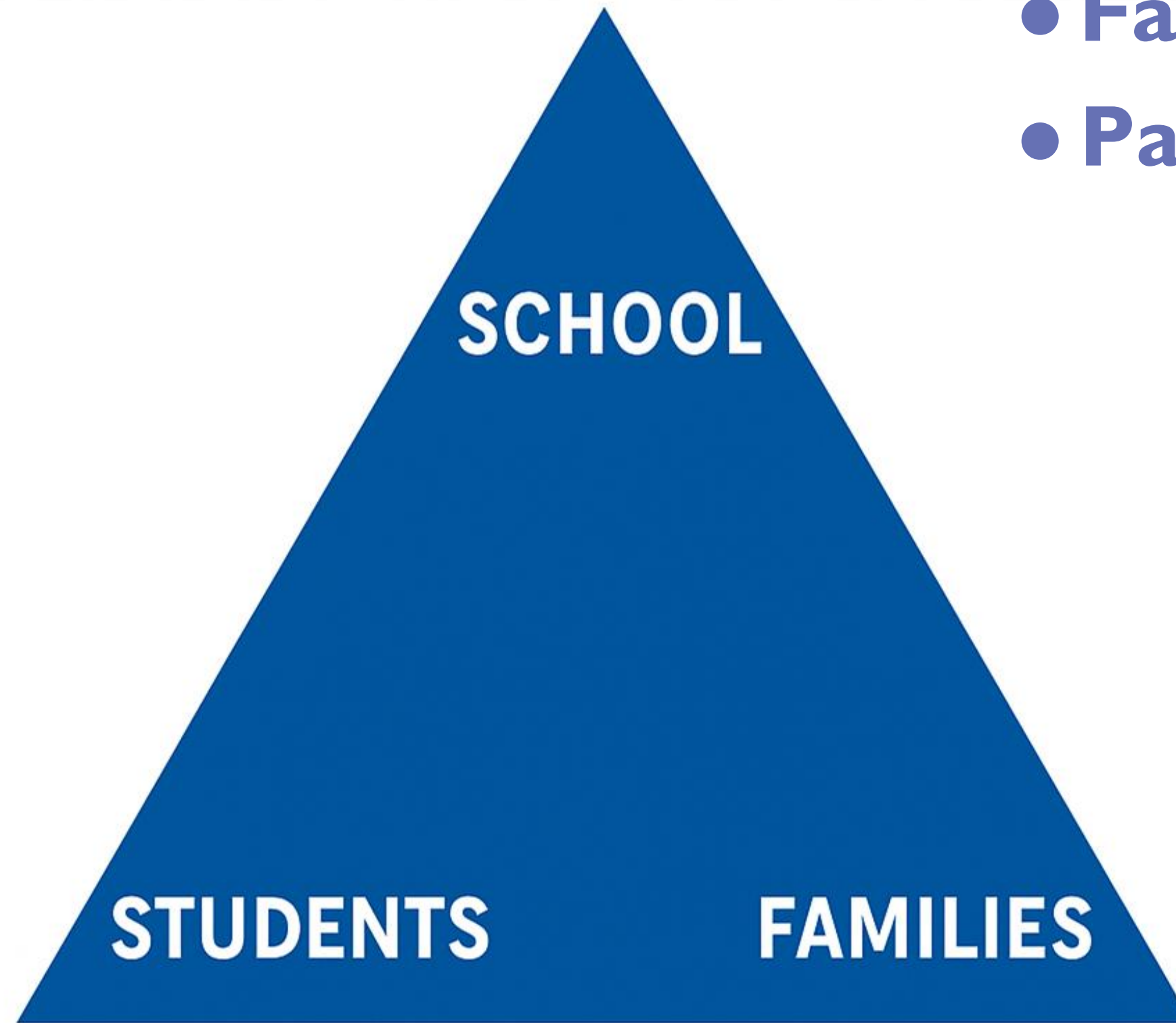

Our Routines

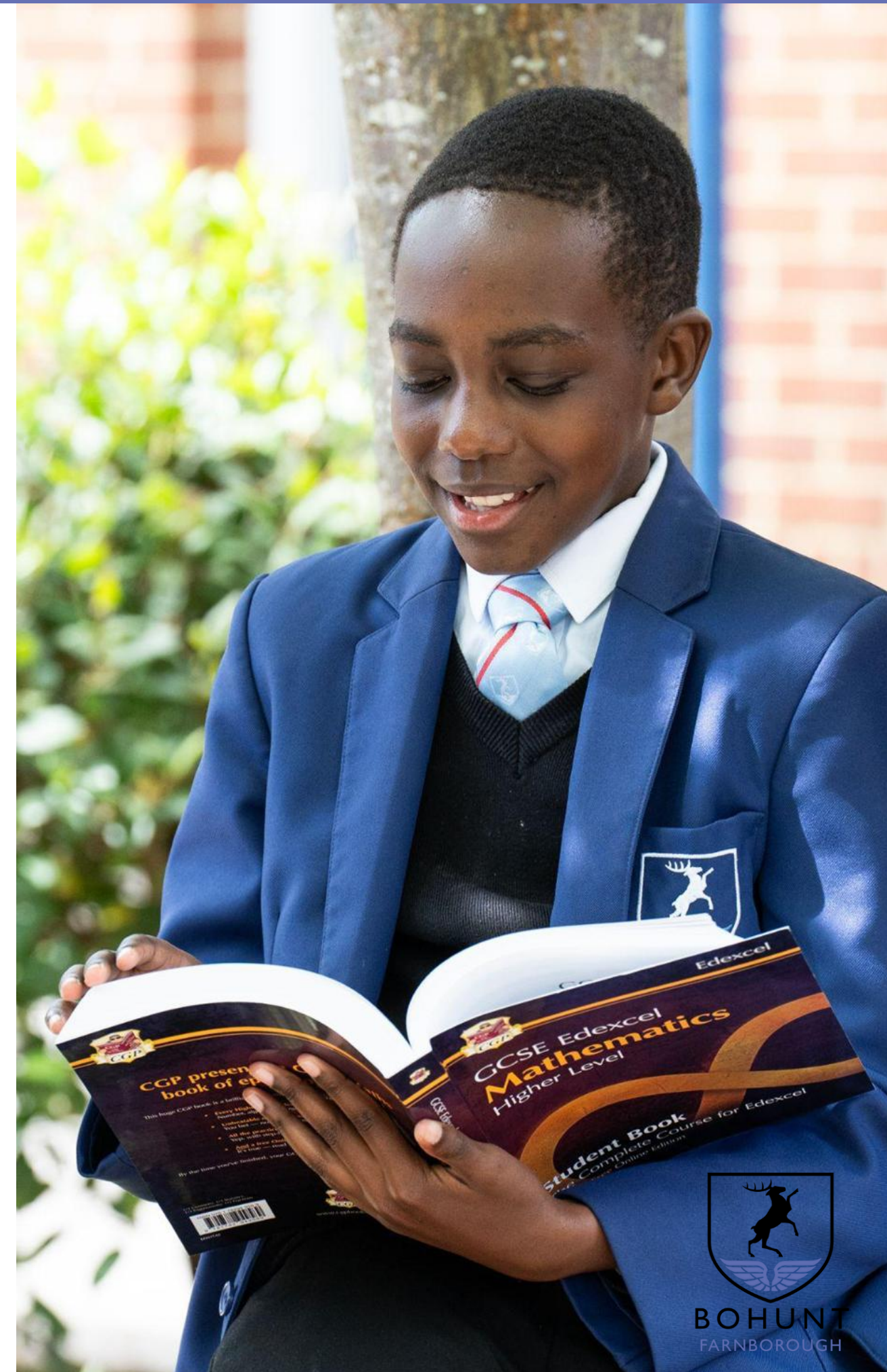
Entering lessons

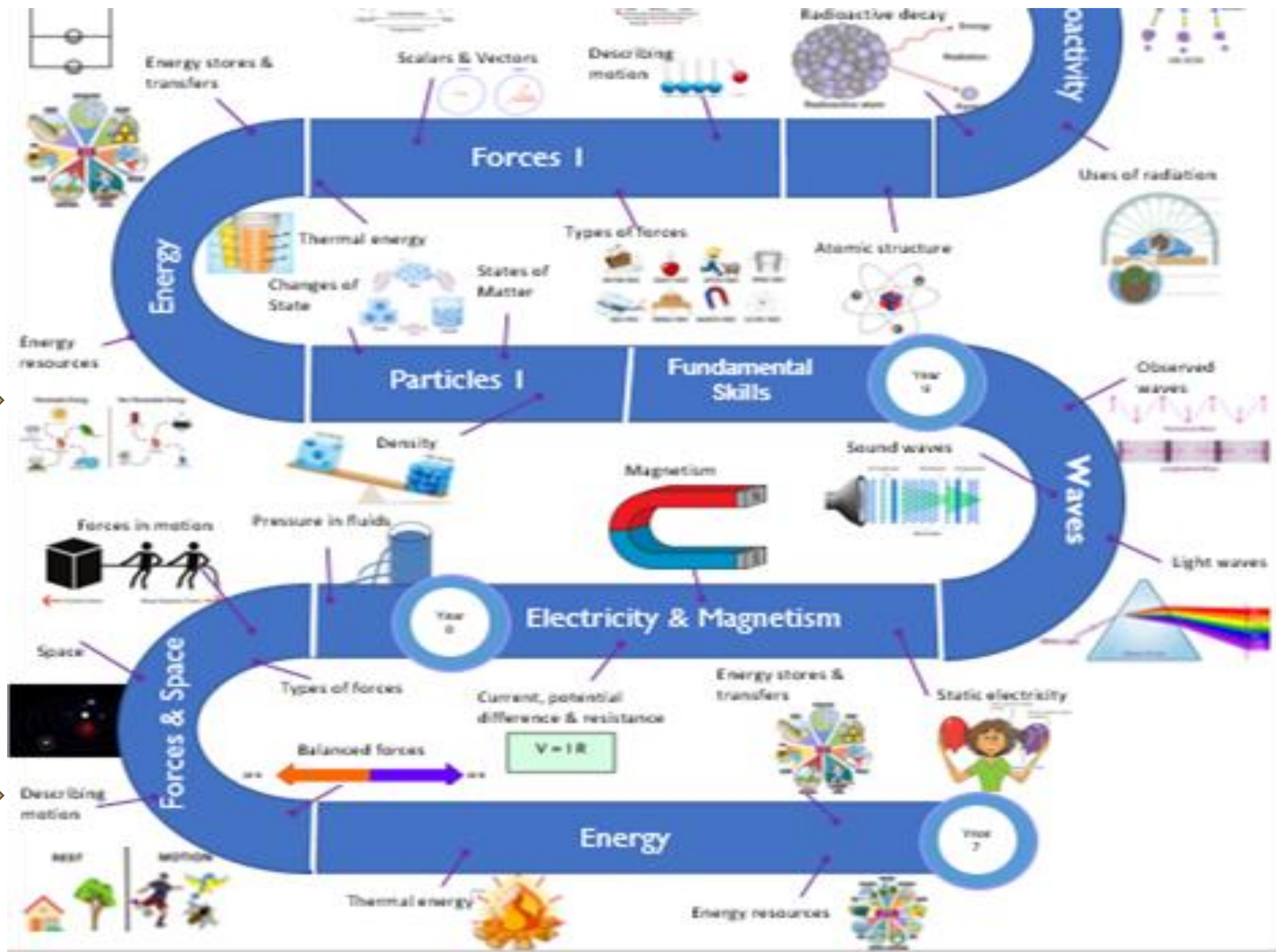
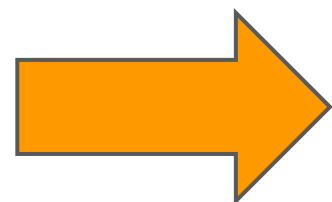
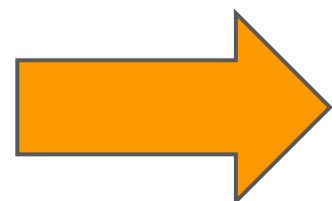
We run a two week timetable.

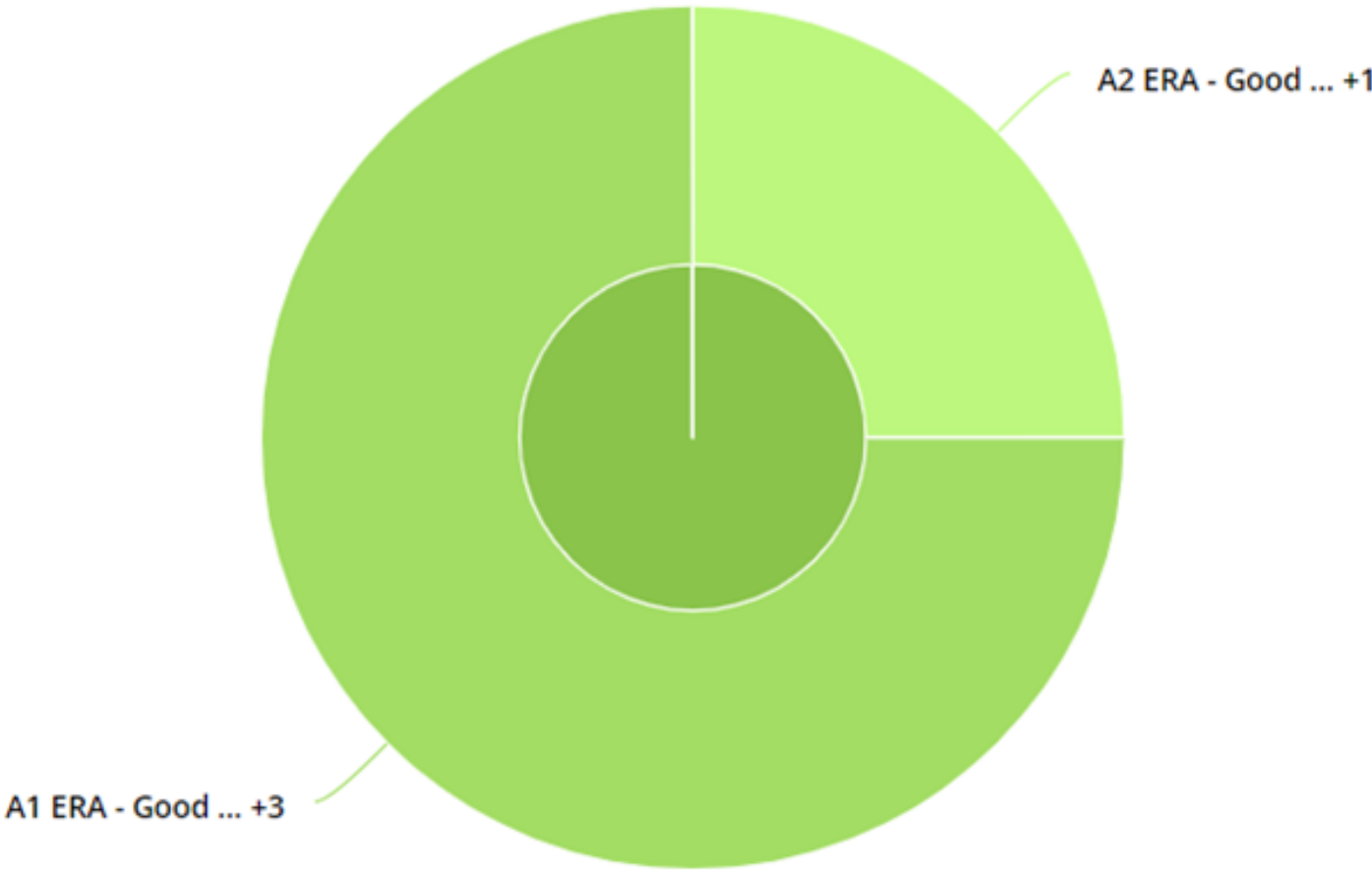

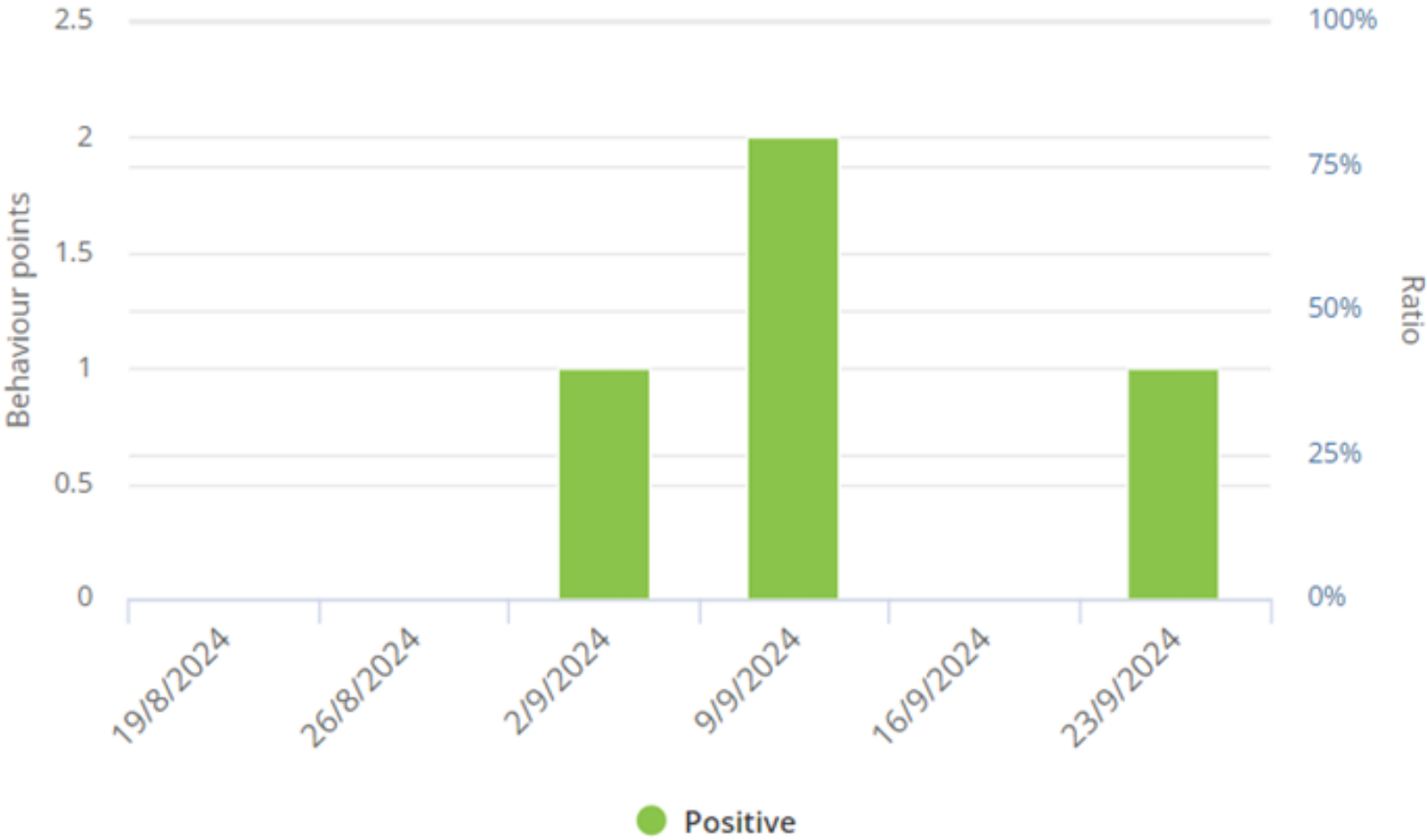

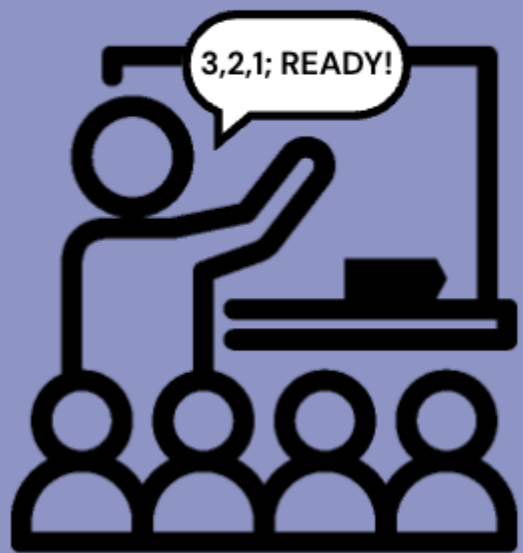
Removal

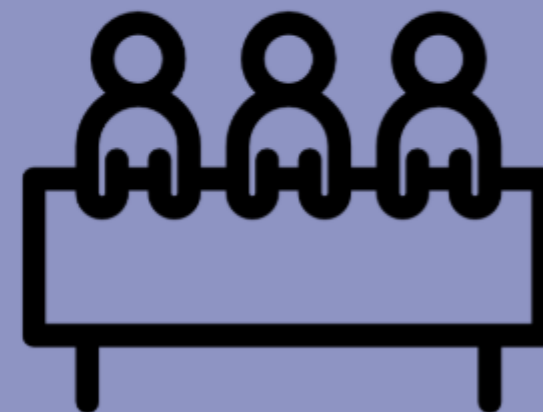

The education secretary is pushing to improve attendance rates as figures show that 150,000 pupils are absent more than half of the time

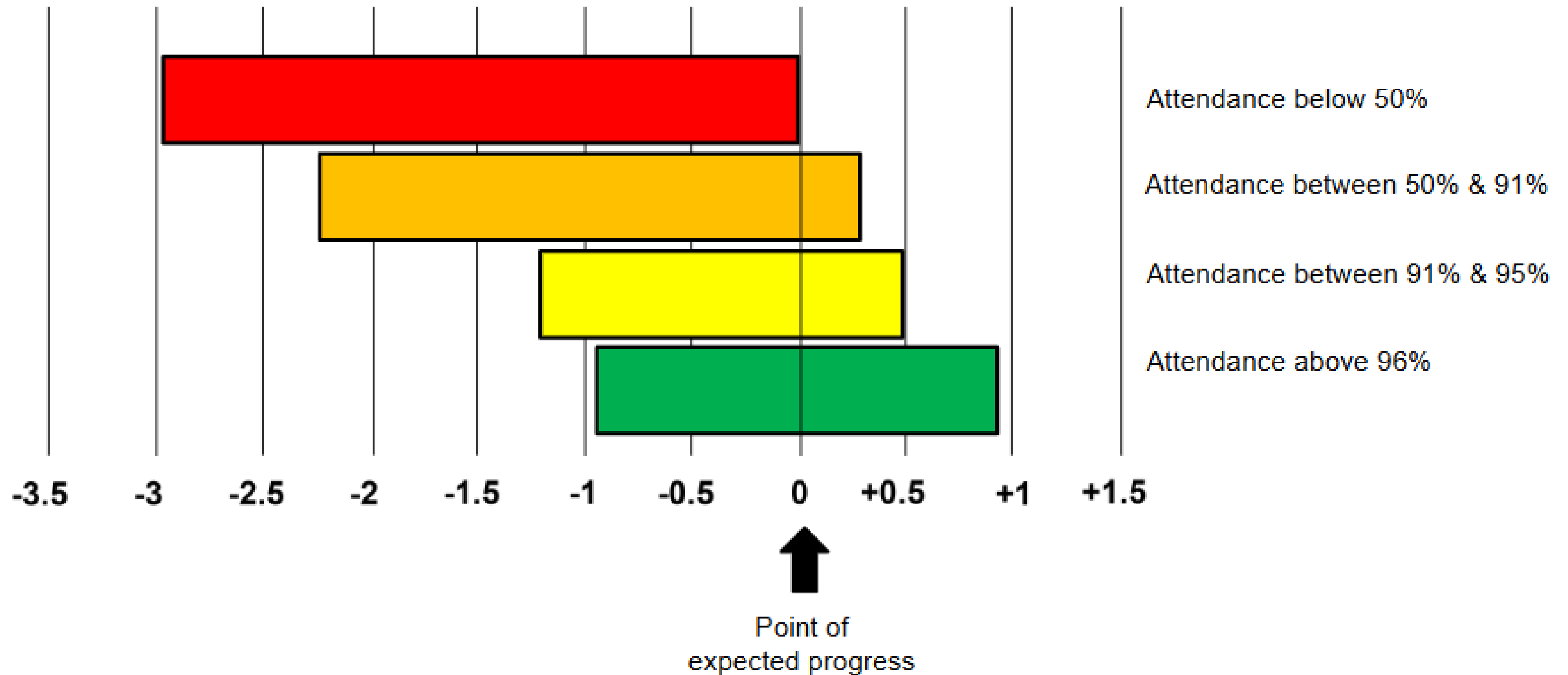
